

MSW REGULAR/FULL-TIME PROGRAM

This 20 course program can be completed in 4 to 7 semesters (around 2 years or less):

1. Fall, Spring, Fall, Spring

****IPED/ SAGE – A Field/Internship Education Requirement**

The purpose of IPED (Inter-Professional Education Development) is to promote inter-professional education among health care professionals to enhance patient/client-centered quality of care and quality of life. Foundation-level MSWs, as part of their Foundation Field experience (SOW 6532 and SOW 6533), will participate in IPED with FAU Nursing and Medical students. IPED includes coursework in a face to face seminar or online format with focus on roles, communication, and health policy. The coursework is mandatory and a part of the field education program.

The purpose of SAGE (Senior Aging and Geriatric Educator) is to introduce students to benefits of working on interdisciplinary teams. Students will visit either Abbey Delray Retirement Community or Ruth Rales Weisman Center for this experiential learning experience with volunteer senior mentors who live there. Foundation-level MSWs, as part of their Foundation Field experience (SOW 6532 and SOW 6533), will participate in SAGE with FAU Nursing and Medical students. SAGE includes mandatory visits to Abbey Delray retirement community or Ruth Rales Weisman Center.
