

How To Support Your Deciding Student

So, your student is currently attending or will be attending school at Florida Atlantic University. Congratulations! Through orientation and advising (EZ Advising) they will receive lots of information to help them prepare.

For many families, having a student in college is an exciting yet anxiety-filled time. In addition, having a student who is exploring majors can also bring up many emotions. What your Deciding Student needs most during this time is encouragement and resources. Each month in our newsletter, we'll have "conversation starters" for you to share with your student. Here are two questions to ask as your student makes their transition to FAU.

"Have you already completed Major KnOWLedge? I'd love to discuss what you learned about yourself."

Major KnOWLedge is an early exploration tool that helps FAU students identify personal interests and their relationships to career pathways.

"Have you registered for SLS 1301? This could be a good opportunity to get extra support and connect with other Deciding Students."

SLS 1301 (Career and Life Planning) is a

1-credit course instructed by a Career Counselor each fall and spring semester for students who have not yet declared a major or are still exploring their options. The course focuses on self-assessment, choosing a major, exploring career options and developing an action plan to help achieve career goals.
