- *Note that the Intellectual Foundations Program requires students to take a total of 4 WAC (Writing Across Curriculum courses). The first two of these will be ENC 1101 and ENC 1102 (or one of the substitutes for ENC 1102); the other two may be taken in any area of your choice. While we have recommended the areas of Humanities and Global Citizenship as two areas in which you could compete WAC courses, please note that you are welcome to complete WAC courses in any IFP area or by completing upper-division WAC courses.
- ** Note that you are not required to take SYA 3010 and SYA 3300 in the same semester. Since both are required for the major and as prerequisites to the two 4000-level courses you will be required to complete to graduate, it is highly recommended that you complete SYA 3010 and SYA 3300 prior to the year you expect to graduate. You may choose to take these two required courses earlier or later in the program than indicated in the flight plan.
- ***Note that graduation requires a minimum of 120 credits; at least 45 of these credits must be at the 3000 or 4000 level. If you are considering a double major, a minor, and/or certificate program, you are encouraged to use your free elective credits for this purpose.) Note also that you are welcome to take more than 30 credits of upper division sociology courses if you choose to use some of your free elective credits for this purpose. Even though the flight plan calls for upper division free electives in your final two semesters, you are welcome to take upper division or lower division credits at any point during your program (so long as you fulfil IFP requirements and complete at least a total of 45 upper division credits.)

You and your advisor will customize your Flight Plan and update it as necessary as you progress through your program.
