8. Business Items:

a) Spring 2014 Steering Committee meetings-New Time Slot

- Steering had no objections to scheduling the Steering Meetings in Spring 2014, for Tuesdays from 2pm to 4pm
- The next Senate Meeting on January 17, 2014, conflicts with the final interview and selection of the President
- Dr. Nyhan proposed to move the senate meeting a week later to January 24, 2013
- All were in favor will be put forward to Senate with positive recommendation from Steering.

b) Online Spot Evaluations

- The Assessment committee was charged with looking at the possibility of moving SPOT's to a hundred percent online.
- The committee received feedback from most of the stake holders and coordinated with all the committees their concerns of moving this forward
- The Assessment Committee came back with positive recommendation to initiate the move one hundred percent in the spring 2014 semester
- The current software will also need to be tweaked and developed to be effectively launched
- Concerns arose on how the P&T committee would review two different versions/response rates of the faculty evaluation. However, the P&T committee has been advised in advance to consider these changes.
- There were concerns relating to less than 100% response rates-no bias of opinion in the evaluation-it will be counted.
- Steering is in favor of this recommendation Nancey France, Chair of the Assessment Committee will present their recommendation to the Senate.
- The committee also discussed marketing strategies needed to remind students to complete the online spot evaluation which the Provost Office will take the lead on. Steering will encourage the faculty to be made more aware of this process.
- It was also agreed to elect someone to assess the online spots to determine the response rates.
- It was also suggested that OIT look at the possibility of making the spots accessible on mobile phones for students
- Steering was in favor of moving forward to Senate with positive recommendation to implement the online spot evaluations in the Spring 2014 semester.

9. Speaker:

- Dr. Perry agreed to speak at the Senate regarding his presentation to the Board of Trustees, his recommendation on the tenth metric for FAU

10. BOT Report:

- The Collective Bargaining agreement went forward positively.
