- The BOG is entertaining potential new metrics and at some point, may consider adjusting the mix or adding specificity to distinguish and define each university.
- It is possible that BOG will adjust some of the benchmarks of the current metrics.
- The issue for FAU is how to get the University out of the bottom ranking.
- The University will gain points due to higher graduation rate projections but may lose points on cost of degree.
