- 1. The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm by Chair, Dr. Kim Dunn.
- 2. UFS Steering minutes
  - The UFS Steering minutes from <u>January 16, 2025</u>, were **approved by the committee**.
- 3. President's Report
- Dr. Dunn's Report Highlights:
  - University Achievements:
    - The university has officially been recognized as a Research 1 institution, marking a significant milestone.
    - o The Board of Trustees has unanimously selected a new president, with final confirmation by the Board of Governors scheduled for February 20th.
  - Success Criteria for the New President:
    - o Retain President Volck within the administration to ensure continuity.
    - o Keep Provost Ivy as interim until a national search is completed.
    - Develop and implement a comprehensive plan to promote student safety and inclusion.

## Spring Elections:

 Announced the upcoming spring elections, with colleges to be notified of senate seat allocations.

#### Committee Meetings Before Departure:

- Current committee members and chairs are encouraged to schedule meetings before leaving.
- With election results announced on April 21st, it is unlikely committees will meet before the end of the term.

## Addressing Committee Leadership Delays:

 Traditionally, committees elect their chair during the first meeting, but delays can lead to leadership gaps, causing committees to struggle at the start of the academic year.

## **Proposed Solutions:**

- **End-of-Semester Meeting:** Encourage committees to meet in the last week of the semester to elect a chair and set fall meeting times. This may be challenging due to scheduling conflicts.
- Interim Leadership Role: Appoint the past chair, past president, or presidentelect to temporarily lead committees, ensuring a chair is elected at the first meeting of the new academic year.

## • Voting Window and Election Results:

- The voting window for elections will span two weeks, with ballots opening on Tuesday.
- Election results will be announced by email, providing committees with ample time to coordinate and select a chair.

#### Discussion on Inviting the New President

The Senate will ensure Mr. Hasner is aware of his membership status and that meetings are added to his calendar early. The invitation will include the opportunity for an inaugural address, promoting a smooth transition and active engagement with the Senate community.

#### 6. UPC Consent Agenda

#### **Consent Agenda Items pulled:**

 The CPO 4409 and FRE 3400 were initially pulled from the consent agenda for further review.

#### CPO 4409 (Course Cancellation) in the College of Arts and Letters:

- The Department of Political Science requested the cancellation of CPO 4409 due to the faculty member previously teaching the course no longer being with the university.
- There were no significant impacts on students as the course is an elective and does not affect degree progress.
- After some discussion, steering moved to reinstate the course on the consent agenda.

#### FRE 3400 in the Honors College:

- A proposed program change for the Honors College involved the addition of language course prefixes, specifically ASL (American Sign Language) and FOL (Foreign Language).
- The FOL prefix is to apply to foreign language courses, providing a one-on-one experience for students in those languages.

- There was some confusion about the FOL prefix, but clarification was provided that it is associated with any foreign language offered by the university.
- After some discussion, steering moved to reinstate the course on the consent agenda.
