

# Steering Committee Meeting Minutes November 21, 2024 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM ZOOM

**Members Present:** Kim Dunn, William Trapani, Bruce Arneklev, Charles Dukes, Khaled Sobhan, Chris Beetle, and Meredith Mountford

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm by Chair, Dr. Kim Dunn.
- 2. UFS Steering minutes
  - The UFS Steering minutes from October 24, 2024, were approved by the committee.
- 3. President's Report
  - Dr. Dunn reported on the following:
  - Presidential Search
    - o Dr. Dunn gave an update on the president search. During the Board of Trustees meeting, there was discussion about the presidential search, specifically regarding the lack of detailed requirements in the presidential profile. Concerns were raised about the broad qualification criteria, including only a terminal degree and no specific requirements for experience or prestige. Faculty concerns were shared, and it was emphasized that faculty input is important for the success of the new president. The Board chair acknowledged the need for both faculty representation and institutional interests. Ultimately, the presidential profile was approved unanimously, and the advertisement for applications was launched.

## 4. Guest Speakers

- Enrollment Planning, James Capp
  - Dr. Capp was scheduled as a guest speaker but had a scheduling conflict and was unable to present at the Steering Committee meeting. However, he was included on the agenda to ensure consensus from steering that he should present at the Senate meeting. A motion was made for Dr. Capp to present at Senate. Motion carries.
- 5. Committee Reports
  - Academic Budget and Planning Committee, Bill Trapani, Chair
    - The committee discussed the challenges related to variations in contact hours within the academic calendar. There was a suggestion to explore solutions to ensure consistent contact hours, though some issues may remain difficult to

- resolve. The committee agreed to continue working on these problems and encouraged further input on calendar-related concerns.
- A reminder was made about the upcoming virtual Budget Forum. Faculty were encouraged to attend or send questions in advance.
- Academic Freedom and Due Process Committee, Dawn Rothe
  - Or. Rothe gave an update on the academic freedom statement developed by the Academic Freedom and Due Process Committee. The committee had met twice, in October and November, to review suggestions from the Senate body and deliberated on a suitable response. After lengthy discussions, they drafted a statement emphasizing Florida Atlantic University's commitment to academic freedom, drawing from core principles of the American Association of University Professors (AAUP). The statement concluded with a commitment to uphold and defend academic freedom. Motion: A motion was made to move forward with positive recommendation by steering. Motion carries.
