- 1. The meeting was called to order at 2:03 pm by Past-President, Dr. Kim Dunn.
- 2. UFS Steering minutes
 The UFS Steering minutes from <u>September 25, 2025</u>, were **approved by the committee.**
- 3. President's Report

Dr. Dunn's Report Highlights:

- Next Board of Governors meeting: November 5–6, 2025.
- Next Board of Trustees meeting: November 18, 2025.
- Proposed increase in out-of-state tuition fees was noted; any approved changes would take effect in 2026.
- Provost search update: Two candidates have visited campus; a third is scheduled for October 30. Members were encouraged to provide feedback via paper forms or the online anonymous submission link.
- Recognition: Florida Atlantic University was highlighted in the AERA Open Access journal as an "Equity Engine" for attracting and graduating Pell Grant students. Four Florida institutions were recognized, including FAU. Appreciation was extended to Dr. Capp and Dr. Ivy for their contributions to student success.
- 4. Guest Speakers (Speakers will present at Senate, not Steering)
 - Julie Golden-Botti, Assistant Provost Center for Online and Continuing Education to present on "Online Program Planning" & "Concierge Suite Support."
 - Christian Block, Assistant Vice President and Deputy CIO to share insights on "Tech Implementations" & "MultiFactor Authentication."
 - Joanne Julia, Director Instructional Technologies, to share insights on "Accessibility compliance."

5. Open Forum with the Provost Provost Ivy reported on the following:

- **Program Productivity:** Efforts on low-productivity programs (as defined by the Board of Governors) continue, with corrective action plans being submitted. Progress noted as the list of programs is shrinking. Appreciation was expressed to all involved for the timely submission of reports.
- Wish Lists and Compliance: Summer submissions to the state were processed, and additional follow-up requests were received and completed. The office confirmed all submissions are compliant and on schedule.

• Performance-Based Funding (PBF) Model Updates:

- The Board of Governors is proposing revisions (PBF 2.0) to funding metrics, to be voted on in November.
- Next year's round (2026) will use the current model; PBF 2.0 will run concurrently but will hold institutions harmless initially.
- Proposed changes include individualized benchmarks for each institution based on historical performance, adjustments for top-performing institutions, additional term for engineering bachelor's programs, and excluding SUS transfers from negatively impacting metrics 4 and 5.
- o Architecture programs with five-year degrees will need a separate review, as simply extending a semester is insufficient.
