Bachelor's Degree Program Information

General Studies Degree Program

The University offers a Bachelor of General Studies (B.G.S.) degree program that allows students to design a plan of study to meet their personal interests and career goals. The 120-credit program includes 15 credits of upper-division coursework in one discipline, which students select in consultation with an advisor. Math Policies and Math Boot Camp Requirement

If during the first attempt of a math course, a failing grade is earned or withdrawal from the math course after the drop/add deadline occurs, enrollment in and satisfactory completion of FAU's Math Boot Camp is required before being permitted to enroll in a second and final attempt of the math course.

Engineering and computer science students are permitted a maximum of two attempts for a single math course, whether at FAU or another institution. If a student withdraws from and/or fails the math course on the second attempt, the student may be required to change their major and leave the College of Engineering and Computer Science.

Preprofessional Program

Entering freshmen and all transfer students will be admitted directly to the College's preprofessional program as pre-engineering students. The following are required for students to be admitted to their major of choice in the College of Engineering and Computer Science:
