Department of History

RE: Change to History major requirements; reduction of credit hours for major

During the 2018-19 AY, the Department of History conducted an extensive self-evaluation in preparation for its official Program review. Based upon this self-evaluation and Program review, the Department of History is seeking to reduce the overall credits required to complete the History major in order to bring the program more in line with programs in peer and aspirational peer institutions. Our present requirement of 42 credit hours in History course work is 3 to 6 credit hours more than other programs. We are seeking to reduce the requirement of 42 credit hours to 36 credit hours.

To achieve this goal while retaining the standards and strength of the required coursework, we are going to reduce the number of Basic Course requirements from 6 courses to 4 courses. Under the new program requirements (to start in Fall 2020), students will be required to successfully complete (with a "C" or better) 2 survey history courses: one in World history (either WOH 2012 or WOH 2022), and one in U.S. history (either AMH 2010 or AMH 2020). Students will still have to successfully complete RI HIS 3150 (Historical Methods) and RI HIS 4935 (Senior Seminar).

We have included the current and proposed changed versions of the Department of History requirements to this memo (proposed changes in bold).

History majors use the study of the past to make sense of a complicated world. Developing insights into past human experiences prepares students for a wide variety of fields, including law, teaching, public history, business, government, communication and even medicine. Professions and professional schools in today's world look for applicants who have broad interests and backgrounds and analytical and verbal skills rather than narrow field specialization. History is a flexible and broad discipline and majors learn how to think critically, evaluate evidence and write with clarity and strength. Students interested in the Bachelor of Arts degree may pursue the traditional major or the major and one concentration. Concentrations available include British History, Legal History, and Religious History as detailed below. An undergraduate Honors Program in History program and a minor in History are also available. Two combined programs are offered, which allow students to earn a bachelor's and master's degree in as little as five years. In the graduate area, the department offers a Master of Arts degree.

Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students

Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lower-division requirements (including the requirements of the Intellectual Foundations Program) and requirements for the College and major. Lower-division requirements may be completed through the A.A. degree from any Florida public college, university or community college or through equivalent coursework at another regionally accredited institution. Before transferring and to ensure timely progress toward the baccalaureate degree, students must also complete the prerequisite courses for their major as outlined in the *Transition Guides*.

All courses not approved by the Florida Statewide Course Numbering System that will be used to satisfy requirements will be evaluated individually on the basis of content and will require a catalog course description and a copy of the syllabus for assessment.

Bachelor of Arts with Major in History/Link to Combined B.A./M.A. Programs/Link to Master's Program (Minimum of 120 credits required)

In addition to other requirements as stipulated by the University and the College, the student pursuing a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History will be required to complete:

- 1. A minimum of 42 credits, including four 3-credit survey courses, a course in historical methods and a senior seminar from courses noted in the tables below:
- 2. An additional 9 credits in upper-division elective courses (3000/4000 level) within the College of Arts and Letters, excluding courses from the Department of History. A grade of "C" or better in each of these courses is necessary to complete this requirement. Additional language courses exceeding that which is required for the History major at the lower division (2000 level) may also count toward fulfilling the requirement.

No grade below "C" in a history course will count as fulfilling requirements for the major, and no history course may be taken under a pass/fail option.
