I am coming back to you inviting you to submit your college's module so I can finalize it and prepare for approvals by January 30. I would like for us to start the approval processes in the first week of February.

I attach the most recent version of the minor (thank you, Mihaela!). I added two newly developed Business courses(in red font) to the electives.

Also, regarding the title of the new proposed AI course in Business ISM 4421: Early in Fall we discussed with Dr. Cardei and the Chair of CEECS about the best title of the course. We agreed on "Business Concepts of Digital Transformation and Artificial Intelligence". However, we are experiencing problems with the schedule, since Banner has a 30-character limit on titles for the schedule. Thus, the key identifier of this course – "Artificial Intelligence" can never make it to appear on the schedule.

Thus, we need to change the course title and make it in synch with content specific courses, such as "Artificial Intelligence for Social Good". Thus, the newly proposed title is ISM 4421 - Artificial Intelligence and Digital Transformation for Business, see syllabus attached.
