Dear Ben, Marcella, and Zhixiao,

The concentration board at the Wilkes Honors College recently made some much-needed updates to our International Studies and Latin American Studies concentrations. Among other things, we wanted to formally expand the opportunities for our students to explore the geographical diversity and teaching expertise of your departments. This has always been done informally by students who register across colleges. But we wanted to formalize it in the concentration so that each elective course taken outside

the college would not require a special appeal form each time a student wants to count it toward the concentration (and so that DARS will actually pick up and count the correct electives in graduation checks). The attached document includes course changes for both concentration, but I have already received notes from the appropriate chairs for the changes in International Studies. The Latin American Studies courses we seek your approval to include are the following:

LAS 2000	Intro to Latin American Studies
HIS 4435	Religion in the Atlantic World
HIS 4437	Magic and Superstition in the Atlantic World
HIS 4451	Slavery and Abolition in the Americas
LAH 3133	Latin American Independence
LAH 3721	Women in Latin American History
LAH 4131	Indians in Latin American History
LAH 4430	History of Mexico
ANT 3163	The Maya and Their Neighbors
GEA 4405	Geography of Latin America and the Caribbean Culture and Environment: Latin America and the Caribbean

The college currently has no concentrators in Latin American studies. So this is unlikely to even be noticeable to the faculty members or the departments offering the courses. I would guess that one or two of our honors students a semester might take one of these classes.

The UUPC is now requesting letters from chairs/directors for any elective or required courses housed outside of the home department. So I'm writing to request your approval to include these courses in our concentration. If there is some reason not to include any of them please let me know and we can remove it. If you have no trouble allowing us to include them, please reply to all with your formal agreement to allow Wilkes Honors College students to count these courses as electives in the Latin American Studies concentration.
