"We simplified the program change for the Transdisciplinary Visual Arts Concentration (see attached). It is now a single-track concentration and we removed courses that are no longer taught. I attached the change program request .pdf as well as a document illustrating how the concentration website will look after the changes have been made. The simplified concentration has passed our college's curriculum committee and is up for a vote on Nov 4 in the Honors College faculty assembly. It will go to the Honors Council soon and then to the UUCP. I am cc'ing Rachel Corr, the co-chair of the HC curriculum committee.
