We no longer think the requirement lets us efficiently use our resources and believe that students are better served by an added content-based elective.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We therefore will delete these 2 classes from the Business program (4 credits).</li> <li>• We will increase the number of Business electives from 12 to 15 (the wording regarding interdisciplinary electives will remain the same; the 3 additional electives will come from Business and Economics electives).</li> <li>• Number of credits to complete the business concentration will fall from 53 to 52.</li> </ul>

Courses exempt from double-counting: Honors Intermediate Microeconomics (ECO 3101), Honors Intermediate Macroeconomics (ECO 3203), and Honors Econometrics: Applied Regression Analysis (ECO 4412).
