Course Description

Students complete a culminating product/performance that is reflective of applied expertise gained in the competency areas of their undergraduate studies with a focus on demonstrating academic program reflection and career readiness. This course is intended to be taken in the semester of graduation.

Prerequisites/Corequisites

This course is intended to be taken in the semester of graduation. Registration is granted by Department Approval only.

Course Objectives/Student Learning Outcomes

- 1) Ability to demonstrate content knowledge in the core competency areas of the degree program
- 2) Ability to demonstrate competency in oral/written communication skills and use of technology for communication appropriate to professional environments
- 3) Ability to demonstrate critical thinking in problem solving and decision making with a focus on creative skills and practical skills
- Ability to demonstrate an understanding of issues related to diversity, equity, and inclusion in US society through perspective taking, cultural knowledge/selfawareness, or personal/social responsibility

Course Delivery Mode

This course is accessible through FAU's learning management system, Canvas. You must log into Canvas with your FAU ID and Password to access the materials and assignments in this course. If you do not know your FAU ID or Password, contact OIT for help.

This course has variable credit hours (1-4). For traditionally delivered courses, not less than one (1) hour of classroom or direct faculty instruction each week for fifteen (15) weeks per Fall or Spring semester, and a minimum of two (2) hours of out-of-class student work for each credit hour. Equivalent time and effort are required for Summer Semesters, which usually have a shortened timeframe. Fully Online courses, hybrid, shortened, intensive format courses, and other non-traditional modes of delivery will demonstrate equivalent time and effort.
