<p><b>Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment.</b></p> <p>In September 2022, the Department of Curriculum and Instruction changed their Bachelor of Arts Degree in English Education (6-12) with ESOL, by adding courses that will lead to Reading Endorsement. Because this added courses/credits to the state approved 120 credit hour program, EME 2040 was removed from the program. In the ensuing months, SPC 2608 was moved to Intellectual Foundations Program - General Education Curriculum. Because SPC 2608 is a required course in the Bachelor of Arts Degree in English Education (6-12) with ESOL and Reading Endorsement, this has opened up three credits in the program. The Department of Curriculum and Instruction would like to add EME 2040 back to the Bachelor of Arts Degree in English Education (6-12) with ESOL and Reading Endorsement. This will put the program at 120 credit hours, and standardize the College of Education course offerings to all secondary programs.</p> <p>Student Teaching hours need to be between 3-9 credits.</p>
