<p>Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment.</p> <p>This minor was created in collaboration with the College of Nursing for WHC students who are interested in postgraduate work in nursing and other health-related fields. For example, to apply for the ABSN program, students are required to take Anatomy and Physiology I & II (with labs), Microbiology (with lab), Human Growth and Development, and Nutrition, among other courses. Currently, none of the existing Honors College concentrations include this full set of requirements, so this minor is intended to address that gap by providing students with a specialized list of courses needed to apply to a nursing program.</p> <p>Description: The Interdisciplinary Health minor was created in collaboration with the College of Nursing at FAU.
