Claudia mentions speaking of the film analysis papers: "Along the lines of questions such as: What is the historical context of the film? What is the historical content of the film? To what extent does the film adhere to or diverge from what we think we know about the past? How is the filmmaker attempting to represent the past? What agenda does this representation serve? In what ways has the film shaped thoughts and actions? These "History through Film" papers will allow you to utilize your historical skills in interpreting film representations of events in modern German history based on what you've learned in the course, as well as any extra related reading." Although this overlaps with some of the questions we ask when analyzing film, it is from a distinct angle with a historian's perspective. I know many of us do historical work in film and media studies, but historians have frequently used film to address representation and grapple with how the past inflects upon the present. Also, the content of the course is unique and doesn't significantly encroach upon any of the courses I know of.
