The department will be changing the course sequence which will move two courses (EEX 4751-Collaboration with Professionals and Families (2 cr) and EEX 4932 Developing Individualized Education Programs (1 cr) to semesters earlier in the program. This will allow students to remain full-time and be better prepared for the FTCE ESE exam by having content taught earlier in their program. (Minimum of 120 credits required)

The undergraduate program in Exceptional Student Education prepares students to teach individuals with mild learning and behavioral disabilities as well as individuals with moderate to severe disabilities.

#### Admission Requirements

All students seeking admission to the undergraduate program in Exceptional Student Education (ESE) must first meet the University's general upper-division admission requirements. In addition, each applicant must:

- Have a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale on the general education component of undergraduate studies OR have completed requirements for a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 2.5 from any college or university accredited by a regional accrediting institution;
- 2. Present passing scores on all sections of the General Knowledge Test;
- 3. Have a recommendation for admission to the program by the Department of Special Education.
- 4. Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students
  Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lower-division requirements (including the requirements of the General Education Curriculum) and requirements for the college and major. Lower-division requirements may be completed through the A.A. degree from any Florida public college, university or community college or through equivalent coursework at another regionally accredited institution. Before transferring and to ensure timely progress toward the baccalaureate degree, students

must also complete the prerequisite courses for their major as outlined in the <u>Transition</u> <u>Guides</u>.

5. All courses not approved by the Florida Statewide Course Numbering System that will be used to satisfy requirements will be evaluated individually on the basis of content and will require a catalog course description and a copy of the syllabus for assessment.

## **Program of Studies**

All ESE courses are offered in a prescribed sequence with specific prerequisites. Students should be programmed as soon as possible to receive appropriate advising. Students must be admitted and programmed by a Department of Special Education faculty member prior to the spring semester of their junior year.
