



<p>Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment.</p> <p>Although this degree was altered in Spring 2025 to reduce credits required to 128, the state has just requested we lower it again. This change is a reduction of five credits to meet the 123 request. The Department has done this by removing the elective credits, shifting a lab to a zero credit linked time instead of a separate credit, and removing a course (Orchestration) for which the material and skills will be absorbed into the conducting curriculum. The change for the lab is a separate course change submitted at the same time as the degree change. One additional course is removed from an elective list as that course will be removed from offerings in a year.</p> <p>Additionally, only for clarity sake, we are striking the Professional Education courses from where they are duplicated in the Catalog. They are still taken, but for some reason ended up listed twice.</p>

The purpose of the Music Education program at Florida Atlantic University is to provide every student learner within the degree program with the best possible instruction. Students follow a plan of instruction based on current music research, societal trends, and the modern American educational landscape. The goal of the degree is to prepare music teachers to enter the workplace prepared to teach learners of different cultures, ages and ability levels. FAU Music Education majors will be able to structure and manage a positive musical environment that encourages these varied populations to experience, achieve, and thus, come to value music-making as a life-time endeavor. Degree completion includes professional certification to teach music in Florida public schools, levels kindergarten through 12th grade.

Students will be assigned by area advisors to either vocal or instrumental programs of study. This program leads to teacher certification in music in conjunction with the Department of [Curriculum and Instruction](#) in the College of Education.
