Academic Planning and Budget reviewed the following programs on 4/6/2026.

- Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence with Criminal Justice
- Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence with Public Management
- Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence with Economics
- Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence with Education

Motions to send the proposals forward with a positive recommendation subject to the provisions below were approved.

1. Update the Memorandum of Understanding to address the following:

- Clearly define who program is for – builders of AI with expertise in discipline (e.g., CJ, Econ, etc.)
- State that the program does not prevent future degree programs that combine AI focused programs directed at other populations of students (e.g., users, rather of developers) of AI in a discipline
- If any college chooses to withdraw from program, the program ceases to exist

In addition, ABP asks the following:

1. Programs are asked to evaluate the following and report back to APB

- Ensure that the students admitted to these programs have the skills (e.g., mathematically) necessary to be successful
 - Is this impacting timely graduation rates?
- Address transfer students needing additional credits, see AI+Econ for example
 - Is this impacting timely graduation rates?

2. Provost Office is asked to evaluate metrics and report back to APB

- One graduate reported as two degrees for internal KPI
 - How does this impact non-participating colleges?
- Credits taken go to college providing the course
- One graduate for BOG per CIP code
