Cooperative leadership, program development, strategic planning and budgeting, legal compliance, organizational management, political and professional networking.

Key Initiatives and Metrics:

Polling and Public Opinion: Created the college initiative for political polling, which trained students in the methodology of public opinion inquiry, aided the development of undergraduate research, and increased university visibility. The Political Campaigning Laboratory has generated over \$350 million in earned media for the university in less than 2 years.

AI Program Development: Led a faculty learning compact on adding, integrating and safeguarding the use of AI in the classroom, for research and for career development of undergraduate and graduate students. Leading efforts to create interdisciplinary AI degree under consideration by the university for 2026.

Grants and Funded Research: Led efforts to expand funded research support in the College of Arts and Letters with over \$2.4 million in private and public grant applications just this year. Helped triple the internally funded research.

Program Development: Expanded the Political Science program with over 4,500 students enrolled in classes and 600 majors with a budget of over \$2 million.

Civic Engagement: Led development of significant department and college program initiatives and degree programs in the areas of Civics Engagement, Data Analytics and Political Campaigning with \$400,000 raised and obtained to date.

Graduation Rates: Assisted the college and Provost with development of policies to increase 4-year graduation rates by leading a team to review the data to identify the problem areas, along with a strategy to address these areas. FAU more than doubled its four-year graduation rate from 19.3 percent to 47.5 percent. The 28-percentage point increase of the four-year graduation rate is the highest increase at an SUS institution.

Community Engagement: Led development of civics education initiatives through new programs, obtained outside funding, and solicited the involvement of leading scholars, journalists, political and community leaders. Obtained grants from local communities. Invited speaker at the Chamber of Commerce and multiple community events. Wrote over 200 columns in 3 years about civics in the USA Today/Gannett network, which has over 6 million registered readers.

Data Science: Led efforts to create interdisciplinary data degrees. Obtained over \$30,000 and created a new data lab for political science to support the Data and Society degree and provide space and resources for undergraduate research.

Promotion and Tenure Revisions: Revised and updated the college tenure and promotion criteria to better provide structure and certainty along with an open and accessible process. Currently manage all P&T in the College.

Curriculum: Managed curricular development across multiple campuses, including the creation of joint degree programs across colleges and flight plans tailored to the needs of different campuses and students.

Oversaw the development and reorganization of the Department Honors Program to increase accessibility and maximize limited department resources.

Shared Governance: Worked with the Provost's office to encourage transparency and develop shared governance by supporting workshops explaining the academic affairs budget. Led efforts to streamline and revise degree programs and develop best practices for faculty governance structures.
