<p>1. Under Degree Requirements (BBA and BS), in the College of Business Core, in the International Perspective section, add ECO 3703 as an additional option to the existing course options.</p> <p>2. Under Degree Requirements (BBA and BS), in the College of Business Core, in the Economics Requirement, add ECO 3703 as an option for the Management Information Systems major.</p> <p>3. Under Degree Requirements (BBA and BS), in the College of Business Core, in the Economics Requirement, add ECO 3703 as an option for the International Business major.</p> <p>4. Under Degree Requirements (BBA and BS), in the College of Business Core, in the Economics Requirement, add ECO 3703 as an option for the Hospitality and Tourism Management major.</p> <p>Rationale ECO 3703 is a new course that is designed to familiarize non-economics majors with the fundamentals of trade theory and international monetary economics. Given that many non-economics majors within the College of Business only take one economics course in the international area, ECO 3703 is ideal in that it gives students a relatively broad exposure to the main concepts of both international trade and international monetary economics. Currently, the department offers the two separate courses, International Trade (ECO 4704) and International Monetary Economics (ECO 4713). The addition of ECO 3703 will offer non-economics majors an alternative to these two more specialized upper division electives. The content in ECO 3703 will not overlap with the third existing option, International Economic Development (ECS 3013), as the latter course focuses primarily on obstacles to economic development within individual countries.</p>
