Re: Elimination of School of Communication and Multimedia Studies BA Pre-Major

Dr. Harvey and members of the DFSCAL UPC committee,

We seek to eliminate the "pre-Major" category for our undergraduate degree programs. This change has already been effected for the "Multimedia Journalism Concentration" of our Multimedia Studies BA, but we now seek to fully eliminate the pre-major for all BA degrees (to include the Film, Video and New Media concentration of the Multimedia Studies BA as well the pre-major for the BA in Communication Studies).

This change requires deleting the "admission requirements" section for Bachelor's Programs as well as relocating language describing a maintenance GPA requirement for the Multimedia Journalism degree to an alternate location in the catalog.

Rationale for change

This change comes as a result of new financial aid regulations which no longer cover non-degree applicable courses (including pre-majors). In order to eliminate this possible financial challenge we wish to remove the pre-major allowing students to declare their major upon acceptance to the university.

Our curriculum and scheduling protocols have been updated and revised since the installation of the premajor and we feel confident the elimination of the pre-majors will not result in adverse consequences for the School or its students.

Change One: Remove the Pre-Major from both the BA in Communication Studies and the BA in Multimedia Studies (Film, Video and New Media concentration). This change requires:

DELETE the "Admission Requirements" subsection from the "BACHELOR"S PROGRAMS" section entirely. This subsection deletion includes removing the following:

All students looking to pursue the Bachelor of Arts with Major in Communication Studies or the Bachelor of Arts with Major in Multimedia Studies with concentration in Film, Video and New Media will first be placed in the corresponding pre-major. Students in the pre-major will have to satisfy the following requirements in order to obtain admission to the major:

- 1. Complete the pre Communication Studies or pre-Multimedia Studies foundation coursework (see below) with a minimum grade of "C" in each course;
- 2. Complete the Intellectual Foundations Core, including ENC 1101 and 1102;
- 3. Attain a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 at the time of application to the major;
- 4. When the above requirements have been met, see the School of Communication and Multimedia Studies advisor to change from a pre-major to a major.

Pre-Communication Studies foundation-coursework:
COM 2053 Introduction to Communication and Civic Life
SPC 2608 Public Speaking

Pre-Abultimedia Studies (Film, Video and New Media concentration) foundation coursework: FIL 2000—Film Appreciation

Effective summer 2016, all admission requirements for the Bachelor of Arts with Major in Multimedia Studies, concentration in Multimedia Journalism are deleted, with the exception of a minimum overall GPA of 2.0, to be maintained throughout enrollment at IAU. Upon applying to FAU, both first time in college students and transfer students can immediately declare their major in Multimedia Studies with concentration in Multimedia Journalism.

Change Two: Revise the description of the Bachelor of Arts with Major ion Multimedia Studies to preserve the minimum required GPA for Multimedia Journalism which would be deleted by "Change One"

Current Language:

"Students who enroll for a Bachelor of Arts degree with Major in Multimedia Studies must choose one of two concentrations: the Film, Video and New Media concentration or the Multimedia Journalism concentration. In addition, students must meet all University and Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters requirements. These include satisfactory completion of a total of 120 credits, 60 of which must be earned at a four-year college or university, and 8 credits in sequence in a single foreign language. A Multimedia Studies major must complete 12 upper-division credits in Arts and Letters electives beyond the General Education requirements or complete a minor or a certificate program. A student whose GPA falls below 2.5 will be dropped from the major. A GPA of 2.0 or higher is required for transfer to the major."

Revised Language

"Students who enroll for a Bachelor of Arts degree with Major in Multimedia Studies must choose one of two concentrations: the Film, Video and New Media concentration or the Multimedia Journalism concentration. In addition, students must meet all University and Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters requirements. These include satisfactory completion of a total of 120 credits, 60 of which



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must be earned at a four-year college or university, and 8 credits in sequence in a single foreign language. A Multimedia Studies major must complete 12 upper-division credits in Arts and Letters electives beyond the General Education requirements or complete a minor or a certificate program. Students in the Multimedia Journalism concentration whose GPA falls below 2.0 will be dropped from the major. Students in the Film, Video and New Media concentration whose GPA falls below 2.5 will be dropped from the major. A GPA of 2.0 or higher is required for transfer to this major."
