## Memorandum

To: Undergraduate Programs Committee

Re: Permission to exceed credit hour limit for the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre

Date: February 24, 2015

The Department of Theatre and Dance is requesting to have the credit limit of 120 credit hours for the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Theatre waived. This request is to render our current BFA curriculum compliant with BOT guidelines and to continue to align our degree requirements with others in the SUS as well as other peer institutions. The BFA is considered a pre-professional degree and, as a pre-professional degree, it is expected that students pursuing this degree emerge from their institutions more highly qualified and better prepared for their careers than students from a Bachelor of Arts program.

A BFA degree in excess of 120 credit hours is quite common and commands greater respect as a pre-professional degree. In the SUS, The University of Central Florida (129), Florida State University (129), and the University of Florida (124) all have credit limits in excess of 120 hours as indicated above. This also holds true at these other peer institutions: North Carolina School of the Arts (132), NYU Tisch (128). Currently, our BFA requires a total of 121-129 credits depending on the student's individual language requirements. This total includes six credits that are required to be taken during the summer as the BFA students participate in the Summer Repertory Season. This fact allows the BFA student to graduate in a timely manner given that the actual total of credits to be taken during the standard schedule of academic terms is between 115 and 123.

Finally, the credit total is not the only component of the BFA in Theatre that is designed with an added emphasis on career preparation. In addition, the BFA curriculum also includes advanced levels of movement, voice and speech, and acting training; all BFA students are required to audition for every production; and all BFA students, while performing in the Summer Repertory Season, earn credit towards their membership in Actors Equity Association, the trade union overseeing stage actors and stage managers (membership in which is indicative of professionalism and expertise).

Based on the above rationale, the Department of Theatre and Dance believes that the BFA curriculum as it currently stands is best suited to prepare our students for success. Please see the attached course requirements for the BFA in Theatre.
