Certificate Tracks and Coursework

The Academy for Community Inclusion is a University-wide program that provides specialized certificates and college coursework to adults with developmental disabilities. Academy coursework is structured into three certification programs:

- Supported Employment
- Supported Community Access, and
- Supported Community Living.

Each certification program has 20 credit hours of course work, including unique Academy courses, regular University courses, and approved electives. Academy students also take three prerequisite courses regardless of the certification track(s) they pursue. These prerequisites include:

SLS 1304: Career Exploration

SLS 1570: Learning with Technology 1
