I believe there needs to be revision to this proposal that removes the strong references throughout the proposal to creating a Health Sciences degree program focused on Interprofessional Education for the Health Professions. This can be accomplished by instead framing this as a degree program that provides a strong foundation in requisite sciences and offers students the opportunity to develop a focus area that includes courses from a variety of disciplines including: Business, Exercise Science, Nursing, Psychology, Philosophy, Political Science and others. So it is multidisciplinary rather than interprofessional education.

As you know (I'm sure you are sick of me making this point) Interprofessional Education (IPE) specifically refers to education of students enrolled in health professions programs such as pharmacy, nursing, medicine, social work, etc. This Health Sciences degree program is not preparing health professionals to practice in any professional role, and therefore this doesn't fit the definition and shared meaning of IPE across the country.

OK – I have purged the document of virtually all references to IPE – other than references in comments from the CAVP and JoAnn's title as director of the OIPE.

I have concerns about the language related to using existing College of Nursing practices such as the Green Memory and Wellness Center and the Diabetes Education and Research Center as internship sites. The Diabetes Center is no longer existing, and we now have a Community Health Center. But, we accommodate health professions students from neuropsychology, nursing, medicine, pharmacy and social work and unfortunately don't have the capacity to accommodate other internships.

Also, with a community-based medical school and large nurse practitioner programs in the Colleges of Medicine and Nursing I'm concerned about adding more students to internships within physician offices. We have difficulty already finding preceptors for our health professions students and this could compromise our ability if they have students in the Health Sciences program "shadowing" physicians and nurse practitioners.

I removed references to Memory & Wellness and Diabetes Center. There is no plan to compete with CON for spots shadowing in doctors' offices. Internships however will help the students find jobs upon graduation. We have spoken with Florida Blue about possibilities in their organization.

There are references to the fact that the Associate Directors from the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing and Social Work were involved in the development of this proposal. Is this so?

I removed this reference because it was frankly irrelevant. However, it read:

This is a new degree proposal that cuts across several departments and colleges. An internal supervisory committee was established composed of faculty members that represent the various departments/colleges with courses listed in this degree program, including the Director of the Office of Interprofessional Education. The Director of the OIPE (along with its Associate Directors from the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, and Social Work and IPE competency-committee members) developed the program into the success that it is today.

"The program" referring to the **IPE program**, not the Health Sciences program. The Health Sciences degree program is obviously NOT a success today as it hasn't been launched yet.

Let me know if you are happy with the new version of the proposal. I will have to send it back to the committee for review, so I'd appreciate it if you could get back to me quickly. There is still a chance we can get this through on the timetable we established.

I'm fine with the curriculum and budget as long as there are funds for adjunct salaries for colleges who are offering courses for this degree program that aren't regularly offered. We discussed this at the last meeting.

Ingrid, I'm not trying to be difficult and am very willing to help to shape this in a different way. As I said I was shocked at the extensive foundation on IPE but I think it can be reshaped to focus on providing focus areas that are shaped by knowledge from multiple disciplines.

I'll try to reach you when I get back from my meeting.

- 3. Update: Policy on Repeating courses
  - a. Students need approvals to take a course for a third time by an academic advisor

  - c. Advisors may have to re-direct them to another major

## 4. Timely Graduation Policy (CESCOS)

- a. Although the policy has already been adopted, CESCOS proposed to include language to reflect this policy in the catalogue
- b. The assembly unanimously voted to include this language (Motion: Carraher)

#### 5. BA in Health Sciences

- a. Updates to the proposal for the BA in Health Sciences were presented to the assembly. Major changes included
  - i. Expanded Faculty committee to serve as an oversight committee and to finalize degree programs
  - ii. Series of concentration offerings for which students must choose one
  - iii. Modification to the names of the courses to better reflect the Health Science focus of this degree program and not inter-professional (based on recommendations from Nursing).Courses will be renamed Health Science 1, 2 and 3.
- b. The assembly unanimously voted to approve this new BA in Health Sciences ( Motion: Beetle)
- 6. Presentation: Three-minute thesis program
  - a. Introduction of the 3-minute thesis competition for graduate students including judging criteria.
  - b. Timeline: Applications in September, Heats in October and Championship in November
- 7. Update from the Provost (Dr. Perry)
  - a. Deans Search: Candidate from UF will accept the position starting in January
  - b. Metrics: GPA adjustments to entry class, GPA raised. Increased efforts to recruit top high school students
- 8. Update from the Interim Dean (Dr. Blanks)
  - a. Positions: 20 positions were requested, 2 positions in Math approved and 9 from recurring existing lines. 10% of startup is provided by the college.
  - b. Building: 2 new elevators in the S&E building as well as painting of the building underway.
- 9. Update from Faculty Senate President (Dr. Beetle)
  - a. Encouragement to attend the Faculty Senate meeting on Sept 12<sup>th</sup>, where there will be a discussion of the Post tenure review policy as well as a discussion of student retention and success.
